Let's run through this PPT

Whilst most have been included & highlighted, what is not and not needed to be highlighted include being constantly vigilant & our constant regular interaction with Ports/customs and various authorities concerned to highlight and attend to the pain points of us ship agents & safeguard the legitimate interests of MANSA and its constituent members

We continued with our endeavors on SCMTR

We all agree that Master and crew of a vessel are the unofficial ambassadors representing their nation, when they visit various ports around the world..

--A ship's first point & major point of contact of communication is the Vessel agent and we as Agents, Pilots, customs, Port health and various officials are the unofficial ambassadors of the port/nation too

(And any all practices both good & bad does reflect as such and the feedback/report card by master is carried accordingly

Vide our various initiatives and endeavours with Authorities at JNP & MBP and surely the JNCH & MBCH, we have tried best to highlight the need to move onto total digital documentation exchange as mandated under IMO FAL and faceless inward and our efforts continue../ We have partnered with MACN in our efforts on EODB and a corruption free environment

Wouldn't want to highlight too much.. Solution for this Malaise could possibly be >>> Single window and digital /paperless/RMS inward- outward

You will all agree that Seafarers are integral and their well-being is essential to shipping

In June this year, MOU was signed between ISWAN and MANSA in order to work together around improving welfare facilities in Indian ports.

Unfinished Agenda /Wish list

- To possibly do away with physical Boarding of vessels by customs and various other authorities... and to only collect documents etc. which could be submitted vide paperless procedure via agents. Any boarding if warranted due to RMS of customs/DRI/Black gang etc. warranting scrutiny/physical check + verification of Master's declaration could be expedited after prior notice (similar to 100% examination of cargoes) and done on camera and/or suitable evidencing measures.)
- Coordinated push/efforts for an unified Maritime single window system/ PCS/CCS/NLP etc.
- Need for unified submission/representation to IT authorities /revenue ministry to ensure standardised procedures for issuance of IT clearance for vessels at various ports etc. -- need SOPs for same under DTAA and the need to avoid heartaches
- Committed to ensure effective SCMTR // EODB for agents

The president gave a short status update on the Service Tax matter as below:

A short status update in the matter of ("MANSA") in Writ Petition No. 2392 of 2017 pending before the Hon'ble Bombay High Court:

1. "Under the GST regime, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of UOI vs. Mohit Minerals Pvt. Ltd. [C.A. No. 1390 of 2022] dated 19th May 2022 has struck down the levy of Integrated Goods and Service Tax ("IGST") on importers in respect of ocean freight services as regards the import of goods into India which are provided by foreign shipping lines to foreign suppliers.
2. Under the Service Tax regime, similar matter pertaining to levy of service tax on ocean freight in the hands of importer is currently pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court in UOI vs. Sal Steel Ltd. and Anr. [SLP (C) Diary No. 27023/2020]. As per the case status displayed on the website of Hon'ble Supreme Court, the said matter is expected to be tentatively listed for hearing on 19th October 2022
3. As decided during the meeting on 30th May 2022, ELP has drafted and kept ready an Interim Application ("IA") incorporating the further arguments that were required to be developed in light of the Hon'ble Supreme Court's decision in the case of Mohit Minerals (supra).
4. However, as the judgment in Sal Steel (pertaining to the service tax regime) will have a more direct bearing on the case of MANSA, the IA would be updated post pronouncement of the Sale Steel judgement, incorporating further arguments that may be developed in view of the said judgment.
5. Once the IA is updated (post Sal Steel judgement), ELP would get the same vetted by Sr. Counsel Mr. Vikram Nankani and thereafter proceed to have the same filed

before the Hon'ble Bombay High Court. Thereafter, the writ petition will get listed for hearing in due course."

MANSA team of committed men and women those of the present EC and all previous EC Members presidents continue to contribute selflessly and endeavour best and Agreed Few names & organisations do readily occupy a share of mind because of the immense visibility and popularity they had.

In challenging times, the competencies are tested. And if the past year is a yardstick, cracks within were clear.

MANSA organised a virtual Complimentary session on the Do's and Don'ts under GST litigation on 2nd June 2023 at 2.30 pm. The guest lecturer Mr. Nishant Shah is a Senior Partner and Co-head of Tax Practice, Economic Laws Practice. The session inter alia covered the manner in which the departmental authorities are likely to pursue the proceedings, some prominent issues that may be picked up by the department under the GST regime, rights of the tax payer at various stages in such proceedings and the possible litigation strategy that one may adopt in the course of such proceedings.

MANSA paid tributes to the legendary maritime icon Rustom Sorabji COOPER who passed away on July 31st, 2023. Popularly called Russi, the multifaceted centurion born on December 14, 1922 was a founder member and distinguished past president of Ship Agents Association of Bombay, now known as MANSA (Maritime Association of Nationwide Shipping Agencies – India). The legend was also a past president of FEDSAI (Federation of Ship Agents Association of India) As a pioneer in the maritime sector, the late Mr. Cooper saw the growth of India's shipping and logistics sector from close quarters and held senior positions in the liner and tramp sector with Patvolk, JM Baxi group, among others. He was the oldest living first-class cricketer in the world, having represented Bombay (1943–44 and 1944–45) in the Ranji Trophy with the Stellar knock of 52 and 104 in the 1944-45, against Holkar. He also played for the Parsees in the Pent-angular (1941-42 to 1944-45) and played county cricket for Middlesex (1949-51) in England. The Shipping Fraternity will miss this guiding beacon and cherish his fond memory for ever.
